Maths:

Mental Maths - Monday - Friday and Problem Solving

We are looking at weight this week. Have a look at labels on food items in your kitchen. You will see that they are usually measured in g (grams) or kg (kilograms). There are 1,000 grams in a kilogram. A bag of sugar weighs a kilogram.

Activity: Make a list of 5 things that are less than a kilogram in your kitchen and 5 things that weigh more than a kilogram in your kitchen or around the house.





Religion:

HOLY WEEK

This holiest week of the Church Year begins on Palm Sunday and ends on Holy Saturday night.



PALM SUNDAY is the beginning of Holy Week. There are two gospels for this Sunday. The first one is read at the beginning of Mass and reminds us of how Jesus came to Jerusalem to celebrate the feast of Passover with his friends. You can find this story in your bible in Matthew 21: 1-11. He arrived into the city on a donkey and on a colt and the people waved palms and shouted 'hosanna to the Son of David' as he passed by. This was their way of showing that they believed that Jesus was indeed the 'Messiah,' the one sent by God to save them. This is why palms are blessed and carried in procession into the church at the beginning of Mass on Palm Sunday. Then we take the palms home with us and put them somewhere that we can see them during the coming year. The priest wears red vestments today because red is the colour of blood and reminds us of Jesus' death on the cross.

The second gospel is the story of how Jesus was crucified. We call it the Passion and we will hear this gospel again on Good Friday. You can find this gospel in your bible in Matthew 26: 14-75 and Matthew 27:1-66.

The last three days of the week are Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is when we remember that Jesus did two very important things during the final meal that he celebrated with his disciples. Firstly, he washed his disciple's feet and then he took bread, broke it, blessed it and shared it with his friends. He did the same with the cup of wine.

He told his disciples to 'do this in memory of me.' So when we come to Mass we are remembering what Jesus did at the Last Supper and doing what he did.



On Good Friday we remember that Jesus died on the cross. In church on Good Friday we listen to the story of Jesus' death and then we are invited to come and kiss the cross. On this day we celebrate Jesus' triumph over death and that is why we call the day 'Good.'

On Holy Saturday night we celebrate a Vigil Mass during which we light the Paschal Fire and a new Paschal Candle, we listen to the story of our faith and we bless holy water. On Easter Sunday we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. The Easter season continues until Pentecost Sunday

(i) Easter Sunday

EASTER SUNDAY

Read the story of the how Jesus' friends discovered that he had risen from the dead. You can find it in your bible in John 20: 1-9

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.' Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went towards the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
