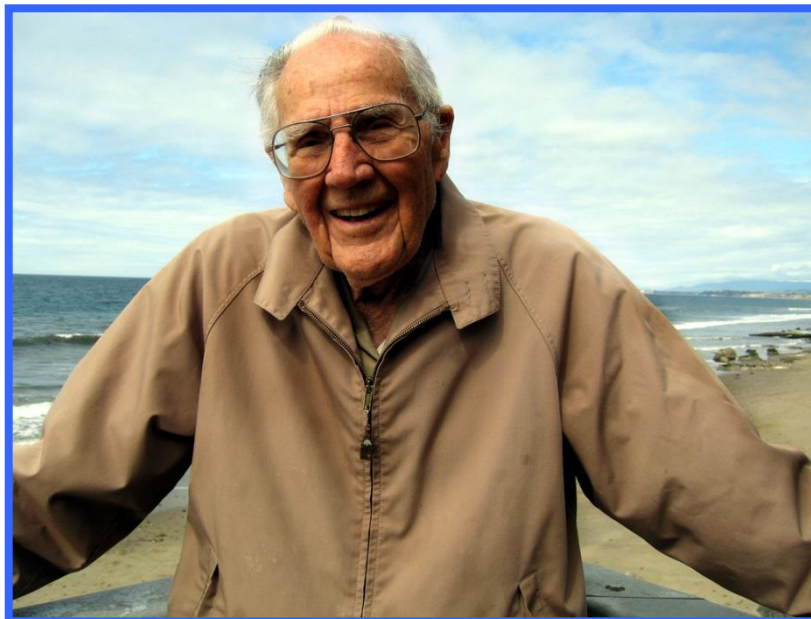


# Using the suffix 'ed'

**LO:** To be able to use 'ed' to change verbs in to the past tense.

When we write in the past tense, we add 'ed' to most verbs.

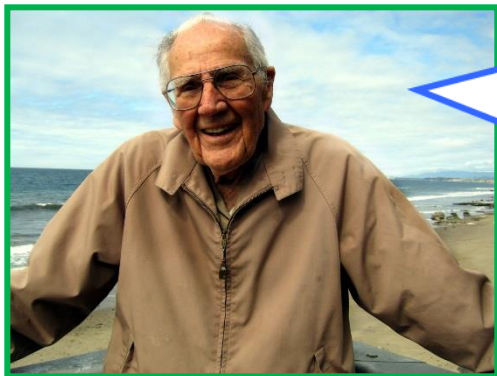
Here's an easy way to help you to remember this....



Uncle Ed is very old.

He likes to remember things he did in the past.

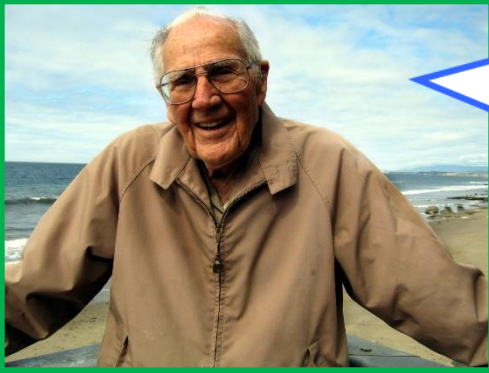
With most verbs we add Uncle Ed's name to change the verb to past tense.



I walk**ed** to the park.

Add 'ed' to walk because Uncle Ed did this in the past!

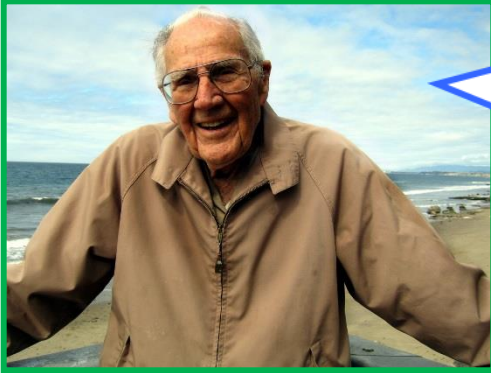




I poured the milk on  
my cereal.

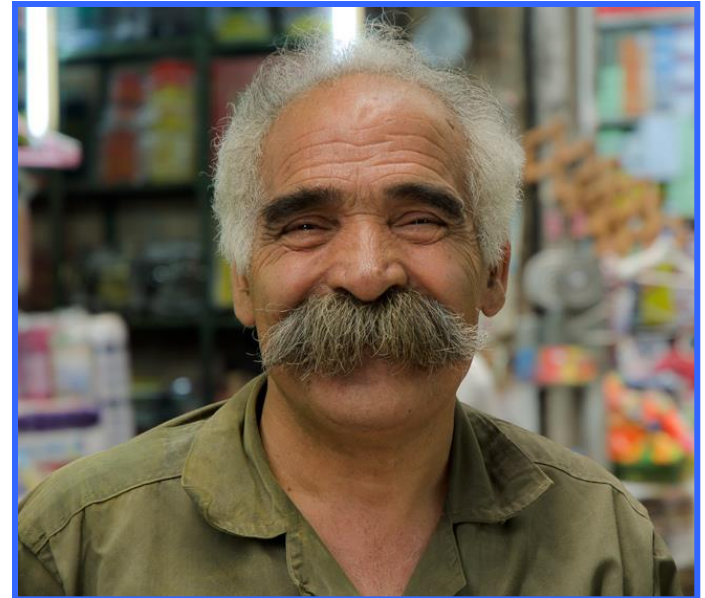
Add 'ed' to pour because Uncle  
Ed did this in the past!

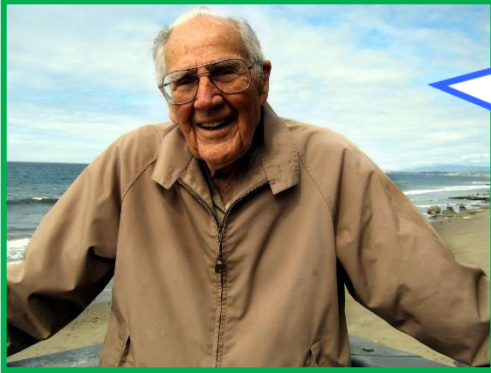




I talk**ed** to my friend Bert.

Add 'ed' to talk because Uncle Ed did this in the past!





I play<sup>ed</sup> football.

Add 'ed' to play because  
Uncle Ed did this in the past!
