# <u>English</u>

- Creative writing- This week the children will have the opportunity to complete a piece of creative writing for a creative writing competition. The children will explore the ocean through a short story or poem. Your child can write a story or poem based around the see and marine life. The begin it may be beneficial to brainstorm ideas with your child and talk about experiences that they have around the ocean. I have included some prompt questions below.
- \*\*PLEASE NOTE- The children would have to send their poem or story <u>typed to</u> <u>me</u> on Seesaw or Word etc so it can be copied and pasted into the entry form online.\*\*

# Prompt questions for creative writing

- What does the ocean mean to you?
- Write about your favourite trip to the seaside.
- What is your favourite ocean creature? What about it do you like the most? Write a story or a poem about it.

- Write a poem or a story from the perspective of a sea creature about the ways in which people are damaging their home with litter and plastics.
- If you had the opportunity to go underwater in a shark cage with great white sharks swimming all around you, would you do it? Write about it.
- Tell a story about going out with your friends on a deep sea treasure hunting adventure.
- You've discovered a new sea creature! Describe the habitat, its relationship with other sea creatures, etc.
- What would it be like if mermaids lived under the sea?
- What would the world be like if there were no oceans?
- You find yourself in a raft in the middle of the ocean. How did you get there?
- Cloze procedure have you child complete the coze procedure called "Miss Dolly" encourage your child to read the piece carefully and then to choose the most appropriate word to fill in.

# <u>Maths</u>

This week we will be continuing with our work on time. The children should be familiar with calendar/ sequencing work from last week, it may be beneficial to revise this again. This week we will be starting to look at analogue time. Your child will be used to seeing clocks in the home, on their watches etc. They will begin by revising o' clock, remind them that the small hand points to the hour and the big hand points to the minutes. Encourage your child to read the time as much as possible during the day. There will be a PowerPoint on seesaw where I will talk through the clock and representing times.



#### <u>History</u>

#### Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> February

<u>English</u>

- Comprehension- A letter from the Bad Wolf (this will be uploaded to seesaw with the English sheets). Read through the letter with your child and the complete the questions. Encourage our child to refer to the story to help them answer the questions. Also encourage our child to answer the questions in full sentence answers. This will be different for them that their normal Away with Words answers.
- Handwriting –This week we will be working on the letter "e". Have your child trace the letters at the top of the page and complete the page (remind your child to use proper pencil grip). Encourage your child to work neatly and remind them to follow the directional arrows at the top of the page when forming the letters. This page will be uploaded to seesaw with the English worksheets.

# <u>Maths</u>

The children will be moving onto ½ past. It is useful to use a visual to show a clock divided in half and where the big hand would land if the clock were divided in half. Children may find it confusing that at the half past the small hand is between 2 number. We have been practicing saying that if the small hand has not reached the number then it cannot be half past that number, for example half past 3 cannot be read as half past 4 because the small hand has not yet reached the number 4 yet.
