Daily work

- New wave Mental maths Week 18 *upload to seesaw daily

English

- Imaginative writing- The children will work on imaginative writing; this is where the children are given a prompt or starter question and they use their imagination to complete a piece of writing. Encourage you child to think carefully about what they want to write, use their imagination to create and try to make their work interesting. Have your child complete the worksheet attached entitled "When I grow up" *upload to seesaw.
- Handwriting This week we will be working on the letter "m." Have your child trace the
 letters at the top of the page and complete the page (remind your child to use proper pencil
 grip). Encourage your child to work neatly and remind them to follow the directional arrows
 at the top of the page when forming the letters. This page will be uploaded to seesaw with
 the English worksheets.
- Comprehension- Away With Words Pg 54 and 55- The Blue Whale. Have your child read through the story and discuss it with them. Complete the activities on Pg 55. A and B (Remind your child use fall answers when answering the questions and not to start and answer with because). All children should write their answers in their homework copies.
- Word endings adding "ing"- This week we will be working on adding "ing" to words. To introduce your child to this topic please have them go through the PowerPoint where I talk them through adding ing to words (on seesaw). Complete Away With Words Pg 31.
 **note that I have assigned an additional task to complete on seesaw entitled " suffix adding -ing to verbs" Please complete this task and submit it on seesaw.
- Phonics work- this week we will be working on phonics using the Sounds like Phonics programme linked on the schools learning assessments page (https://slp.cjfallon.ie/) click on the link and click into Sounds like Phonics book C. Click into Unit 3 The Library. Then click on the "ow ou" sound. Complete the activities for this sound (mouth position, blending

,true or false, word sorting and mystery books. Complete ow ou phonics worksheets attached Pg 15 *upload to seesaw.

<u>Maths</u>

This week we will be beginning work on fractions. We will be focusing on fractions of a shape and fractions of a number. Have your child watch this video to introduce them to the topic of fractions https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=362JVVvgYPE

Have your child watch the PowerPoint where I am discussing fractions of a shape (on seesaw)

Discuss with your child about fractions and where they may have experiences fractions in real life i.e. pizza, bar of chocolate, orange etc.

Fractions of a number- have your child watch the PowerPoint where I am discussing how to find a fraction of a number.

Discuss with your child why they might need to divide an about into fractions i.e. sharing a bag of sweets or marking the halfway point in a book etc.

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Mathemagic – Pg 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 72
Figure it out- Pg 44, 45, 46, 47 *upload to seesaw.
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I have uploaded additional tasks on seesaw in relation to fractions.

Additional activity – make a list of things in your home that can be divided into halves or quaters, either by shape or by number, ask your child to show you half of objects around the house and ask them to divide sets of objects into halves and quaters.

Problem solving – I have uploaded a series of problem-solving questions and activities to seesaw, have your child work through these answer them. The children have learned to use the RUDE method of problem solving, encourage your child to use this when they are completing the problems

- Choose the First Class book/P3
- Choose Theme 4 We hear the Gospel at Mass
- Choose lesson 2- We listen to the Gospel
- Click on the video "Mass The Gospel" discuss this video with your child. You may want to discuss the following points-
- That the people stand to greet the Gospel

- That they sing "Alleluia" as a way of welcoming the Gospel reading that people make the Sign of the Cross on their foreheads, lips and hearts before the gospel is proclaimed.
- That the Gospel is proclaimed by the priest
- That there are responses which we say at the beginning and end of the Gospel
- Complete Pg 26-27 in Grow in Love
- Practice and sing the "Alleluia" (lyrics are on the grow in love site)
- Ask your child to name any bible stories that they may have heard at Mass. Have your child recall some of the bible stories that we have covered in school this year. Here are the links to 2 of the stories if your child would like to listen to them again.

Bookmarks

As the children are learning about the Gospel this week and it is such a special book. There is an additional lesson on bookmarks. Show your child a bookmark and chat about it and its purpose. Explain to your child that there are many sections in the Bible and in order to find a particular story easily a bookmark is a great idea.

Art activity- have your child design their own Bible bookmark (I have uploaded templates from Grow in love on seesaw, each of these represents a bible story). Encourage your child to use their new bookmark and to remember the Bible story each time their use it.

SESE

Geography – This week we are learning about how to take care of our community in winter.

Watch the animation "Taking care of my community in winter" on seesaw. Discuss the video with your child. Ask your child to think about ways in which winter might be a difficult time for people or animals in their locality. Ask them to explain why they think these difficulties arise and encourage them to suggest ways in which they or their families could help to alleviate some of these challenges. You may wish to discuss the following: checking on elderly neighbours; clearing ice or snow from pathways outside homes; ensuring that animals have adequate food, water and shelter; how farmers adapt the environment to care for their crops and animals; protecting plants from frost and ice by taking them indoors or placing them in a greenhouse; caring for possessions such as bicycles or scooters by storing them indoors during bad weather, etc

Complete worksheet "Taking Care of My Community in Winter". Have your child talk about the pictures and write about the ways in which the Little Explorers are helping their community or environment. They write three ways that they can take care of people, animals or their belongings in winter.

History – This week are going to be looking at schools in the past. Have your child listen to me reading "Mary's story" on seesaw. Discuss some of the differences in Mary's school

experience and your own. Have you child compare Mary's experience to their own school experience. What a Wonderful word Pg 32, on this page look at the 2 pictures and discuss the similarities and differences in the 2 images. You may want to focus on the following questions-

- *What is the difference in the children's clothes?
- *Can you work out how many years difference there is between the 2 pictures?
- *Do the children in the pictures look happy?
- *If you had to go to one of the schools, which one would you choose and why?

Complete Pg 33 in What a Wonderful World "How schools have changed." Have your child interview an older person (it can be parent or grandparent or even aunt or uncle). *upload to seesaw

Science- This week we will be learning abut healthy eating and keeping active with a focus on food. Watch the PowerPoint video "Food groups" where I go through the different food groups and their job. After the PowerPoint have your child name the 5 food groups and give you an example of a food from each. Complete What a Wonderful World Pg 61, your child will have to unscramble the words to spell out the names of different foods. Seesaw activities, have your child complete the healthy eating activities on seesaw. Throughout the week continue to engage your child in discussions about healthy eating and have them help with meals, and choose healthy snacks etc.
