Vocabulary:

Ordnance Survey Ireland (OSI) is the national body that is responsible for creating and maintaining the mapping records of Ireland.

Cartographer: a person who draws and makes maps.

National primary road – roads marked in green, they are major roadways that link large towns and cities, they are always named with a capital letter N and a number e.g.

N4 = the national primary road between Sligo and Dublin,

N17 = the national primary road that links Galway to Sligo

N16= the national primary road that goes from Sligo towards Enniskillen in Co. Fermanagh- it stops at Blacklion, Co. Cavan which is on the border with Northern Ireland

Regional road: Regional roads are smaller roads that link cities/towns and villages in Ireland. They are always shown in orange on a map and are named with the capital letter **R** followed by three digits e.g. the regional road from Sligo to Rosses Point is the R291

Contour lines: lines shown on a map that join places that are equal in height above sea-level.
