Topic: Fractions

This week we are going to revise the areas of fractions we covered before the Christmas holidays through problem solving. It is very important to show full working out.

Monday: Os. 1-6 P. 38 Textbook (T.B.)

Tuesday: QS. 7-12 P,38 T.B. (when asked to order fractions with efferent denominators, it is important to change them all to the same fraction family first i.e. find the common denominator, then it is much easier to order them.

e.g. $\frac{3}{6} = \frac{1}{9} = \frac{2}{3}$ Put these fractions in order to size from the smallest to the largest

First ask yourself what is the common denominator for the numbers 6, 9 and ? - what is the lowest number these three numbers will divide into evenly?

Ans: 18

Write each fraction as its equivalent fraction out of 18

$$\frac{3}{6} = \frac{9}{18}$$

$$\frac{1}{9} = \frac{2}{18}$$

$$\frac{2}{3} = \frac{12}{18}$$

So in order of size starting with the smallest fraction: $\frac{1}{9} = \frac{3}{6} = \frac{2}{3}$

History:

Nelson Mandela.

We will be learning about Nelson Mandela.

Geography:

Key vocabulary:

meteorologist: a person who studies the weather and makes forecasts about the weather based on the evidence/data they have collected.

Weather lore: Sayings about the weather. These sayings have developed over time based on people's observations of the weather and have been passed on by word of mouth e.g. Oak before ash we are in for a splash, ash before oak we are in for a soak i.e. if the leaves on the oak tree appear before the leaves on the ash tree, there will be some rain in the summer, if the ash tree's leaves appear before the oak's leaves, we will get a soaking (lots of rain).
