Art:

Chinese New Year is a Chinese festival that marks the beginning of the new year and lasts about 15 days. Because the holiday is based on the lunar (or moon) calendar, its date changes every year and usually falls at the end of January or during the first half of February. It is sometimes called the Spring Festival and is hundreds of years old. It is celebrated this Friday, 12th February. The dragon is an important symbol in China. It represents good luck and a long life. In China, you will see dragons everywhere. They are on temples, palaces, and walls. At the Chinese New Year celebrations, you could see a Dragon Dance. During the dance the performers hold poles and raise and lower the dragon to scare away evil spirits.
