Focus sounds - 'ai' and 'j'

- Watch the two short video clips on the above sounds (Seesaw).
- After watching each video brainstorm some more words containing each sound.
- If you have some playdough you could use it to make the letters/sounds. You could also practise formation on a mini white/chalk board or in a tray of salt/sugar/rice using your finger.
- Complete additional worksheets based on sounds covered to date for further practice (Seesaw).

Each sound should be covered over two days:

Reading (daily)

- Continue revising tricky words covered to date: 'I', 'the', 'he', 'she', 'me', 'we', 'be'.
- Introduce new tricky words 'to' and 'do'. The 'o' in these words has a 'long o' sound as in the words 'moon'/'soon'.
- Practise making your tricky words with playdough, writing them on a mini white/chalk board or tracing them in a tray of salt/sugar/rice.
- If you have wooden or magnetic letters you could use these to make your tricky words.
- Wordboxes: Revise all words in Wordboxes 1-5.
 - Introduce and practise words in Wordbox 6 (All known sounds).
- <u>Reader 1:</u> Bob Bug (This does not need to be printed. It can be read from the screen. Assistance will be needed with capital letters.)
- <u>Reader 2:</u> Click on the link below to access the Oxford Owl website. If you sign up you will gain access to a selection of free ebooks in their free ebook library.

In the free ebook library under the heading 'Browse by Oxford Level' select 'Oxford Level 1+' and choose the title 'Big, Bad Bug'. The main characters in this book are Dad, Biff, Chip and Kipper. Use the picture of The Robinson Family on Seesaw to introduce the characters before reading.

- If you cut out the words in each word box you could lay them face down on the table/playing surface and ask your child to choose a word, flip it over and read it. If they get it right they keep it, if they get it wrong they put it back and choose another word. This might make the reading task a little more exciting. Choose one/two wordboxes at a time as using all of the words at once would be too much.
- Please feel free to send me a video or audio clip of your child reading some of their words or their reader.
