Junior Infant Work Week of 8th-12th February

<u>Story</u>

Listen to teacher read the story 'What Colour is Love?'.

Maths

- Monday: Counting to 4: Complete pgs. 76 (Busy at Maths)
- Tuesday: Counting to 4: Complete pg. 77 (Busy at Maths)
- Wednesday: Watch the video on 3D shapes (Seesaw).

Discuss the properties of each shape (the number and type of faces, number of corners, number and type of edges) e.g. a cube has 6 square faces, 8 corners and 12 straight edges.

Complete pgs. 47&48 (Busy at Maths).

- Thursday: Complete pg. 49 (Busy at Maths). Identify and colour the shapes that can roll. A cube/dice does not roll!!
- Friday: Conduct a shape hunt in your home/garden. Template attached.

There is an additional worksheet on identifying shapes which also revises data for anyone who wishes to complete it.

Phonics

- Continue revising all sounds covered to date: s-j (daily)
- You can also practise the corresponding songs and actions by clicking on the You Tube link below.

Focus sounds - 'oa' and 'ie'

- Watch the two short video clips on the above sounds (Seesaw).
- After watching each video brainstorm some more words containing each sound.
- If you have some playdough you could use it to make the letters/sounds. You could also practise formation on a mini white/chalk board or in a tray of salt/sugar/rice using your finger.
- Complete additional phonics worksheets for further practice (Seesaw).

<u>Each sound should be covered over two</u> days:

Monday & Tuesday - 'oa'
Wednesday & Thursday 'ie'
Friday - Revision

Handwriting (All Write Now)

Complete pg. 30 based on 'oa' (Tuesday)

Complete pg. 31 based on 'ie' (Thursday)

Reading (daily)

- Continue revising tricky words covered to date: 'I', 'the', 'he', 'she', 'me', 'we', 'be', 'to', 'do'.
- Introduce the new tricky word 'was'. The 'a' in this word has a short 'o' sound. Your child can try and sound it out like they would with their wordboxes and should realise that it doesn't sound correct this way. This may help them identify the correct pronunciation.
- Practise making your tricky words with playdough, writing them on a mini white/chalk board or tracing them in a tray of salt/sugar/rice.
- If you have wooden or magnetic letters you could use these to make your tricky words.
- Wordboxes: Revise all words in Wordboxes 5&6.
 Introduce and practise words in Wordbox 7 (All known sounds).
- Reader 1: The Big Cod. Assistance will be needed with capital letters and 'y' and 'w'
- Reader 2: Catkin the Kitten. There are two new characters in this story (Wilma and her brother Wilf)
- Play <u>Snakes and Ladders</u> to practise Tricky Words and the 3 diagraphs covered to date (ai, oa, ie).
- Play Tricky Words Bingo:
 - o Lay out all 10 tricky words on the playing surface.
 - Each player should divide a sheet of paper/mini white or chalk board into 4 boxes.
 - Instruct the players to choose 4 of the tricky words and write one in each of the 4 boxes.
 - Begin calling out the tricky words. The first player to have their four words called is the winner and must shout BINGO!!
- Please feel free to send me a video or audio clip of your child reading some of their words or their reader.

Fine Motor Activities

- Chinese New Year Pencil Control Worksheet (Seesaw). This is quite detailed and does not have to be completed in one sitting.
- Shape Dragon Cutting Activity (Seesaw).
