Senior Infant Work Week of 18th-22nd January

I have uploaded a short video on <u>The Post Office</u> as this would have been our Aistear theme for the month of January. We also would have been looking at The Post Office in Geography. I have also included some nice activities the children can complete based on this theme. <u>One activity could be completed daily</u>.

Activities include:

- 1. The Post Office 'Colour by Number'
- 2. The Post Office 'Roll and Colour' game
- 3. The Post Office 'Crack the Code' activity
- 4. The Post Office 'Playdough' mats. These <u>do not</u> need to be printed!! The children can simply look at them on the screen and make their creations with their playdough.
- 5. Design your own postal stamp art activity

<u>Story</u>

- Watch the video of teacher reading the story 'Burglar Bill' (Seesaw).
- Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story and write a sentence or two about it (Handwriting copy).

<u>Maths</u>

- Master your Maths Week 13 (Daily exercise)
- Monday: Complete pg. 59 & 60 (Busy at Maths) based on addition to 8.
- <u>Tuesday</u>: Begin work on Pattern. The children should be familiar with this topic from last year but I have attached a link to a video below called 'Patterns with Milo' to refresh their memories on this. The link will also be posted on Seesaw.

I will also be posting a video lesson of my own to Seesaw based on patterns.

- If your child has Lego/coloured blocks/beads and thread/different coloured playdough they could use these materials to practise making some patterns.
- <u>Tuesday:</u> Complete pg. 47 on 2D shape patterns (Busy at Maths).
- Wednesday-Friday: Additional pattern worksheets (Seesaw).

Phonics: Focus sound - ow

'ow' has two sounds. The first was looked at last week and had the same sound as 'ou' e.g. town. This week will focus on the second sound 'ow' makes which is a long o sound (same as 'oa) e.g. snow. In each of the words below we hear that long o sound.

• Please practise reading the 'ow' words below:

- <u>Wednesday</u>: Choose 3 of the above words and put them into sentences in your handwriting copy.
- Thursday: Complete the attached 'Fill in the blanks' activity sheet.
- Friday: Complete worksheet to revise the two sounds of 'ow'

Reading (daily)

- Continue to revise all tricky words covered to date with particular emphasis on words 31-40.
- New tricky words (which can be added to the list printed last week):
 - 41 any
 - 42 many

We have not completed work on the 2 sounds of 'y' at the end of a word but we have encountered them on a few occasions so the children's attention has been drawn to them. In both of the above words the 'y' at the end says 'ee'.

- Attached reader: Dive! Dive! (No need to print it. It can be read from the screen.)
- Tricky Words Sentences Teacher designed sentences to practise tricky words.
- If you sign up to Oxford Owls by clicking on the link below you can gain access to a selection of free e-books in their free e-book library. We are currently working on Oxford/Oxford Reading Tree Level 3 in school so you could select some titles your child likes here and read, read, read!!!

- Complete <u>Ceacht 4</u> (Lesson 4) Listen to the comhrá (conversation). Click on the speech bubble symbol to access these.

 - Tá Niamh, Oisín agus Teidí ag teacht isteach. Niamh, Oisín and Teddy are coming inside.

- Complete the interactive tasks: dathaigh (colour) and tasc éisteachta (listening task) to reinforce the above vocabulary (under game controller symbol)
- Listen to and practise singing the amhrán (song): Tá Teidí ag Teacht Isteach (Teddy is coming in). Do this as many times as necessary until your child can sing it independently. Lyrics below:

Each lesson should be covered over 2 days to ensure your child is familiar with key vocabulary.

SESE (Science)

- Items such as a cold bottle of water, an ice pack, a heat pack/hot water bottle filled with warm water, a clay mug, a soft toy could be put into a 'feely' bag. The children will be familiar with this concept. Ask your child to reach into the bag (without looking) and describe the item they touch as cool/cold or warm/hot. Once they have described the item they can make a guess as to what the item is before pulling it out of the bag to see if their guess is correct.
- Talk about items found around the house that are hot and items that are cold.
- Complete the attached 'Hot and Cold' cut and stick activity.
- Look at the effects of heating and cooling on items through experimentation. Suggestions below (Pick and choose):

<u>Chocolate</u>

- 1. Break a few pieces of chocolate from a bar and show them to your child.
- 2. Heat the chocolate gently in a bowl in the microwave or in a saucepan on the hob and question your child on what has happened (The chocolate melted and became a liquid when heated).
- 3. Pour the melted chocolate into a bowl/glass and put into the fridge over night.
- 4. Observe the result: The chocolate has become hard (a solid again).

<u>Water</u>

- 1. Take a small bottle of water. Explain to your child that water is a liquid.
- 2. Place the bottle in the freezer overnight and observe the change the following day. Question your child on what has occurred (The water has become solid, has turned to ice on freezing).
- 3. Leave the bottle out until it has thawed and returned to liquid form. Ask your child why this might have happened/why it didn't remain as ice (increase in temperature melted the ice).

<u>Egg</u>

- 1. Crack an egg into a bowl and mix gently. Explain that this is a liquid.
- 2. Take another egg and hard boil it.
- 3. Crack the egg open and show your child what the egg looks like now. It is a liquid no more. Heating has hardened the egg.

SESE (History)

• Watch the video presentation on Vincent Van Gogh and discuss the 3 paintings mentioned in the presentation using the questions posed on screen.

<u>Art</u>

- Paint your own version of 'Sunflowers'/'Starry Night' or both if you wish.
- I will also post some Van Gogh colouring sheets based on the above paintings for anyone who would like to do some additional colouring work.

- Introduce the poster of Jesus' home (Seesaw). Remind your child that Jesus lived in a town called Nazareth with Mary and Joseph.
- Chat about Jesus' home using the questions below or similar questions:
 - What do you think of Jesus' home?
 - Would you like to live there?
 - Does Jesus' home look like your home?
 - What's the same/different?
- Look at and discuss presentation 1 and 2 on The Holy Family (Seesaw).

• Complete pgs. 28 & 29 (Grow in Love workbook)

I have put the poster of Jesus' Home and the two presentations of the Holy Family into one file on Seesaw. <u>This does not need to be printed!!</u>
