

Phonics: 'Magic e and the letter a' (Short video on Seesaw)

I have drawn the children's attention to <u>'magic e'</u> on numerous occasions in school and they are familiar with the rule. 'Magic e' sits silently at the end of the word. It scares the vowel and makes it say its name. I have attached the 'Magic e Poem' to remind the children of this.

There is one consonant between the vowel and the magic e at the end. Example below:
